- (1) Goal of the Class: The goal of this class is to provide students with the skills and knowledge they need to write effective non-creative fiction. By the end of the course, students should be able to research and analyze information, develop clear and engaging narratives, use descriptive language to create vivid settings and characters and balance factual accuracy with engaging storytelling.
